MBS Activities:

- Annual Picnic: Our Annual Picnic is held at Black Hill Regional Park, sometime in late summer where we gather and meet other bluebird devotees, and exchange ideas and information on bluebirds, while sharing a light lunch and soft drinks. Bluebird related hardware are displayed (nesting boxes, predator barriers), and resource material is available.
- Trail Dedications: Through the efforts of MBS, Frederick County has officially designated a bluebird trail in Middletown Park, the Betty Nichols Bluebird Trail in memory of its founder, the late Betty Nichols.
- County Coordinators: MBS members are available locally to answer questions that come up on bluebird related issues. Through this effort we maintain the interest and support of members and non-members for the wellbeing of bluebirds.

- Speakers: Knowledgeable and experienced speakers are available to local groups that want to learn about attracting bluebirds, including nesting habits, building and placement of a nesting box, predator control, and habitat.
- Newsletter: “Bluebird Chatter”, published quarterly, provides news and tips of interest to bluebirders, including stories on other cavity nesters, and where you too can express your knowledge, experiences, and ideas to the group.
